GENERAL CAMP PROGRAMS

Any girl in grades 4-7 as of September 1, 2018 is invited to attend Greene County Baptist Girls' Camp, Monday through Friday, July 16 – July 20, 2018. *Girls are placed in cabins according to grade, and are not necessarily placed with a cabin leader from their church unless requested.*

Many opportunities are offered at Girls' Camp, including canoeing recreation, crafts, worship services, devotions, swimming & water slide, music, quiet times, nature, cookouts, campfire, and many other great activities!

WHY GO TO BAPTIST HILL?

Throughout the week, there are several objectives we try to accomplish, but our main mission for the week is:

To lead each person a step closer towards a lifelong walk with Jesus.

STAFF

Our staff is made up primarily of volunteers from the churches in Greene County who GIVE of their time in God's service.

CAMPER HEALTH & MEDS

A registered nurse is a member of the camp staff, and is available 24 hours a day. A doctor is as near as Mount Vernon (4 miles). If a camper has prescription medications that she will need during camp, please send them in the original prescription bottle in a labeled zip lock bag. Your church will be collecting all medications before getting onto the bus. They will be given to the camp nurse and kept at the Nurse's station. It will be dispensed by the nurse until the end of camp. If the camper has been exposed to a contagious disease in the two (2) weeks prior to camp, she regrettably will not be allowed to attend camp.



LOST AND FOUND

We ask each camper to LABEL ALL BELONGINGS! All items left after camp ends will go to the Greene County Association Office located at 834 W. Battlefield, in Springfield. After a few weeks, anything unclaimed will be taken to Grand Oak Mission.

PHONE

A phone is available at Baptist Hill for emergencies. The camp phone is NOT for camper's personal use. Parents may call to check on their daughter at any time, but there is just no possible way to allow over 200 girls to use the camp phone. The camp phone number is (417) 466-3358. **Campers are not allowed to bring their cell phones to camp.**

HEAD LICE POLICY

All campers' heads will be checked the first day of camp before any belongings are unloaded from the church vehicle. No girl will be accepted on the first day of camp with live head lice or nits for ANY reason due to Baptist Hill policy. If a girl has lice or nits, she will be sent home in her church vehicle with a letter to her parents. Please check your child's head or have a professional check her 1 week before camp. We do not wish for any girl to be sent home for lice.

VISITORS

We are happy to welcome visitors during Worship on Monday night from 7:15 to 8:30 p.m. or during the final Worship time on Friday from 11:30 a.m. to 12:15. Please limit your visits to these times. No meals will be provided for our visitors.

CHECK-IN FOR GIRLS CAMP

Girls' camp will start at 12:30 p.m., on Monday, July 16th. *Please do not arrive earlier than this to allow the staff time to prepare for the girls' arrival.* When church vehicles arrive, they should pull up to the Temple. Pull in behind the last vehicle in the check-in-line, staying in single file, and pulling off to the right side of the road as far as possible. **Drivers please stay with vehicle.** Belongings must remain in the vehicle until all girls have been through lice check and registration in the Temple. The adult helping the girls with registration will need to give the medications that were collected at the church to the camp nurse after head lice check. Cabin assignments will be provided at this time. The driver may then pull the vehicle ahead to the far east end of the dorm (Bldg. 14). **Please do not block the road.**

Parents and registration persons may help carry belongings to cabins.

Please be sure campers know who will pick them up and please make sure all belongings are off the bus for girls staying at camp. When leaving, exit out the back gate.



CHECK-OUT FOR CAMP

Check out will begin at 12:45 on Friday, July 20th. You may load camper belongings after they are dismissed from the cafeteria at 12:45.

Parents and persons picking up girls are welcome to attend the final Worship Time at 11:30 and lasting until 12:15. The girls will then have lunch and be dismissed at 12:45.

Once again, entrance will be through the front gate. Please exit through the back gate.

ATTIRE: The following is the dress code for Baptist Hill.

- Modest shorts, capris , or jeans may be worn during the day.
- Halter tops, spaghetti straps, translucent clothing, miniskirts, or apparel that exposes the midriff are NOT to be worn at any time.
- Modest 1-piece swimsuits without cutouts are acceptable. ANY other type of suit will require a t-shirt worn over it per the policy of Baptist Hill.
- Casual dresses, skirts/tops, long or capri pants and tops may be worn to supper and worship.
- Closed toe shoes are recommended. Remember that Baptist Hill is a camp and the ground can be rough and rocky.
- No t-shirts or other clothing depicting alcohol, drugs, non-Christian rock groups, tobacco products, or questionable language, please.
- Please do not bring any DRY CLEAN ONLY or “special” clothes to camp.

Items NOT to bring: Gum, **PHONES**, radios, CD players, MP3 players, video games, extra food, fireworks, weapons, alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs. **Electronic devices will be collected and kept in the camp office until camp is dismissed.**

plastic drinking cup with lid

plastic bag (for wet clothes)

dirty clothes bag

3-4 hangers

clothespins
